Botanical Collections Internships

Duties and Responsibilities

Basic, recurring jobs include weeding, planting, mulching, and brush clearing. Common tasks include:

- Planting trees, shrubs, perennials, annuals,
- Pruning trees and shrubs,
- Preparing planting beds,
- Dividing perennials, and
- Operating equipment including tractors and gators.
- All botanic gardens interns will do weekly documentation of learning and skill development. This portfolio or field record will be shared with all staff on the last official day of the internship

Based on need and interns' interests, work may also include:

- Scouting plants for insects and diseases to assess overall plant health
- Assisting with arboricultural activities involving instruction on climbing techniques
- Assisting with landscape construction and stonework
- Assisting with our plant records database, conducting elementary surveying and mapping of plant collections
- Assisting with current Plantations landscape design projects involving site planning, design development and implementation

Requirements

- Ability to commit to the entire internship period,
- Currently enrolled or accepted Cornell University student,
- Coursework or work experience involving plants or the natural world,
- Enthusiasm for the horticultural field,
- Ability to alternative between independent and group work,
- Ability and willingness to do repetitive tasks,
- Learn to follow proper safety protocol,
- Ability to lift 50 pounds,
- Participate in weekly group intern activities as scheduled,
- A valid driver's license is very helpful though not mandatory.

This is a full-time, 12 week internship. Must be able to work the Saturday of Reunion Weekend
Typical work hours are Monday 7:30 a.m. - 4 p.m. Tuesday-Friday 7 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.

Work Environment

These positions spend most of the workday outdoors within Plantations' botanical garden areas and arboretum. The job provides an excellent opportunity to get hands-on training in a wide

variety of tasks under the encouraging direction of numerous staff members. Interns are rotated based on the week's work and individual interest. On a given day, the three interns may all work together, in pairs, or singly with various horticultural staff.

Each Monday from June to August interns will participate in Learning Mondays, a series of workshops that may include field trips or educational activities about the diverse work of a public garden. All botanic gardens interns will do weekly documentation of learning and skill development, Capturing Your Experience. This portfolio or field record will be shared with all staff on the last official day of the internship, Farewell Friday.
