

**Objective of the Visitor Education Intern**

To learn the primary functions of a visitor education program at a major public garden, with emphasis on adult programs and tours, interpretation, and visitor services.

**Duties and Responsibilities**

Assist the Community Outreach Coordinator and the Interpretation Coordinator in a variety of projects, programs and activities. The internship is designed to provide a broad-based introduction and exposure to various educational operations at a botanical garden. Some specific assignments may overlap or run throughout the summer.

Activities may include:

- Assisting the Community Outreach Coordinator with the planning and implementation of adult classes, workshops, tours and/or special events.
- Assisting the Interpretation Coordinator with development of interpretive materials, displays, and printed material.
- Assisting as needed with other education initiatives and activities.

**Requirements**

- Currently enrolled or accepted Cornell University student
- Comfortable speaking in front of small and large groups
- Knowledge of plant science, taxonomy and/or general horticultural principles helpful but not necessary
- Good communication, research, writing, design, and computer skills
- Interest in, and comfortable working with adult learners
- Good sense of humor and people skills
- Ability to work various weekends throughout the summer
- Participate in student activities and field trips as scheduled
- Must have or be able to obtain a valid driver's license
- This is a 12-week internship. You must be available to work Reunion weekend.

**Work Environment**

The intern will work primarily in an office environment that is highly collaborative. There will also be opportunities to work outdoors in the gardens and natural areas of Cornell Plantations. Research may involve visits to libraries or other off-site locations.

Each Monday from June to August interns will participate in Learning Mondays, a series of workshops that may include field trips or educational activities about the diverse work of a public garden.
